A charge of £6.00 per day will be made for 30 hour funded children to cover items from the list below

We provide:-

- 3 meals per day where applicable
- Snacks, fresh fruit
- Nappies where applicable
- Formula milk of your choice
- Sudocrem and wipes
- Suntan cream (Boots factor 40 for children)
- Toothbrush and tooth paste where applicable

Half days are 07.30 to 13.00 or 1300 to 18.00

Failure to pay fees by the 15th of the invoiced month will result in the suspension of child care pending full payment of arrears. We accept all major credit or debit cards

One months notice or one month's fees in lieu are required when a child is withdrawn from the nursery.

Fees are payable from the start date identified on the enrolment form.

Bank holidays are charged for

A discount of 5% is given when two or more siblings attend nursery on the same day.

Subject to a minimum of 4 weeks notice, half fees will be charged for 2 weeks in any one year for the family holiday for full-time children and pro rata for part-time children. (Standard contract only)

We are approved by Kirklees Childcare Sufficiency Team to provide 15 hours per week free childcare for 2 year olds and 30 hours per week for 3 and 4 year olds, for 38 weeks in a year.

Four weeks notice in writing is required to change agreed sessions.

All booked additional sessions will be charged for, whether taken or not

Should a child not be collected by 18.00 hours the following late fees will be charged

18.00 - 18.05 no charge
18.05 – 18.20 £ 15.00
£ 6.00 for every 5 minutes after 18.20.
